

DMD-PhD Application Instructions

Below is a list of all documents required for review by the DMD-PhD Admissions Committee of the University of Florida. Follow the instructions for submission of each set of documents.

- DMD-PhD Application Form. Print and submit the signed paper document or email a pdf of the signed document.
- A Curriculum Vitae following the “Application Curriculum Vitae Template”. Print and submit the signed paper document or email a pdf of the signed document.
- Letters of Recommendations. Three letters of recommendation are requested from faculty that have either mentored you in your current or previous research, or are familiar with your research. If you are a current UF DMD student in semesters 6 or 7, one of your letters may be from a faculty member of the UF COD that can attest to your clinical abilities and time management skills. For each reviewer, fill out the top half of the “UF Graduate School Recommendation Letter” form, then print, sign and send to each reviewer to complete the bottom half. Each reviewer must submit a completed form along with their letter of recommendation.
- Copies of all transcripts; Undergraduate, DMD and any other Graduate transcripts (Official transcripts are not necessary at this time)
- **Current UF DMD Students Only:** Dean’s Certification Form and any Accompanying Letters. Fill out the top half of the form, sign and submit to the COD Office of Education. The Office of Education will forward the completed form to the DMD-PhD Coordinator. Note: If you have accepted a position in the DMD program but have yet to start the 1st semester, you do not have to submit these documents.

Note: If you are offered a position in the DMD-PhD program you will be required to submit your official transcripts and DAT scores. The official documents are to verify self-reported scores and for files in the DMD-PhD program in the College of Dentistry and in the Interdisciplinary Program in Biomedical Sciences.
